BREXIT

- Explaining Brexit: "It was not the economy. It was identity."
- Business and Brexit: "Businesses cannot wait for a new EU-UK political arrangement. Important decisions are made every day, every hour."
- Brexit and the EU: "An opportunity for renewal? A tall order."
- Brexit and security: "The EU will not have a credible foreign and security policy without Britain."
- Can Brexit be aborted? "Unlikely but not entirely impossible."

THE UNITED STATES

- Tocqueville, Trump (and Brexit): "Revolutions happen when things are finally getting better."
 "The election of Trump is unlikely but not impossible."
- Inequality: "People mind when they stop advancing."
- Free trade: "The US presidential campaign has already damaged the future of free trade."
- USA and Europe: "There is a gap between Urbania and Provencia."

THE WORLD ECONOMY

- Will globalisation and integration continue? "The jury is out." See Martin Wolf's notes.
- Regulatory overkill: "The corporate governance of publicly listed companies has become a joke."
- Pessimism and global growth: "Economists see only problems and system failures; start-ups see only opportunities." "Much will depend on India."
- Education: "Everyone on the planet wants to go to university. Is that what we want?"
- Demography: "There will soon be more Africans than Chinese people. The millennials will make up the majority of the work force in Western countries in a few years."

RUSSIA

- Good news: "Latent rapprochement? The number of diplomatic and political contacts between the West and Russia is increasing."
- Bad news: "A remilitarisation of the NATO-Russian border has already taken place: accidental war is possible."
- The Russian economy: "Stabilisation coupled with stagnation."

TECHNOLOGY

- Good news: "Nowadays, bad news comes from politics; good news comes from science and technology."
- Bad news: "GMO was a European innovation. Today, Europe is side-lined from its development."
- Tech Revolution: "Hyperloop, Uber, self-driving cars and quantum leaps in life sciences; it is all happening as we speak. Are we ready for it?"
- Dealing with the Tech Community; four major models:
 - 1. The Libertarian Model (USA) Embrace the Techies and let them be
 - 2. The Authoritarian Model (China, Russia) Embrace the Techies and use them for your own political ends
 - 3. The European model (the EU)
 Hit them with regulation and antitrust fines
 - 4. A Synthesis? (The Nordics, Singapore)
 Embrace them with state-sponsored
 technology programmes (hoping that one
 does not suffocate them with one's embrace.)

LEADERSHIP

- New vulnerabilities: "The executive is faced with more vulnerabilities than at any other time in peacetime history."
- The new business environment: "Low entry cost and fast pace of change are changing the environment in which decisions are made. Add geopolitical uncertainty and what do you get? The nature of today's decision-making is closer to wartime conditions than peace."
